On behalf of Safari Club International, I would like to thank you for the opportunity to comment on the proposed changes to the Wildlife Management Area (WMA) regulations for the state of South Carolina.

SCI is dedicated to protecting the freedom to hunt and promoting wildlife conservation and, being so, we appreciate the Department's commitment to increased public access and opportunities.

SCI agrees with, and supports, the Department's proposed regulations that would allow for additional opportunities on four WMAs. The increased access would, as noted by the DNR, generate additional license sales and revenue for the state as well as provide benefits to the local economies where these WMAs exist. These proposed changes generally demonstrate responsible and sustainable management of the state's public land and wildlife resources.

SCI believes that sound science-based conservation involving hunting as the primary management tool, while maximizing opportunities for all huntable species is necessary to the long-term health of wildlife. Hunters have long paid the way for conservation, both game and non-game wildlife, and maximizing opportunity for hunting is also key to long-term funding for all conservation.
