Dear Chapter President,

As we begin to put the COVID-19 pandemic in the rear-view mirror, SCI's leadership is excited that our chapters are once again offering unrivaled hunting and fishing expeditions as part of their fundraising efforts.

When offering these fantastic hunting experiences across the world, it is important to bear in mind SCI's official policy prohibiting the sale of captive bred lion hunts.

This policy, which was ratified by SCI's leadership on February 4th, 2018, unequivocally states:

- SCI opposes the hunting of African lions bred in captivity.
- This policy applies to hunts taking place after adoption of this policy and to any Record Book entry related to such hunts.
- SCI will not accept advertising from any operator for any such hunts, nor will SCI allow operators to sell hunts for lions bred in captivity.

Therefore, we ask that all chapters do their part to ensure that no captive bred lion hunts will be offered in raffles, auctions, or in any other avenue.

Failure to do so compromises SCI's ability to protect the rights of hunters across the globe and, as such, chapters found to have violated this policy risk their charter status with the national organization.
